SPAN Project Guidelines for Endorsement

Between the Bridges staff and the Community Insight Team are on standby to support SPAN Project Teams to meet the following guidelines:

- Involvement of at least 4 residents
- Involvement of at least 2 partner organizations (private sector, public sector, or non-profit sector), one
 of which will provide basic financial administration to the project that includes receiving funds,
 disbursing funds for the project expenses, and providing a record of transactions
- No financial commitment from residents or partner organizations is required
- A fully completed SPAN Project Outline describing how the project will support Community Fabric
- A concept of how success of the project will be measured
- A completed SPAN project budget
- Agreement to complete financial and evaluation forms within 30 days of Project completion
- A willingness to see challenges as learnings, feel comfortable adapting project plans as they unfold and take time to celebrate success along the way!
- SPAN funding may not be used to pay salaries or wages to individuals.
