Learnings of the Organization from a Collective

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In fall 2022, Inspiring Communities released a retrospective review of what our evaluations have revealed after nearly five years of collective impact work. Key findings include the challenges of building trust and other pre-conditions for successful collective impact; the difficulty of including diverse community voices; and how hard it is to describe the work. This was a major undertaking, and one we have looked forward to tackling.
